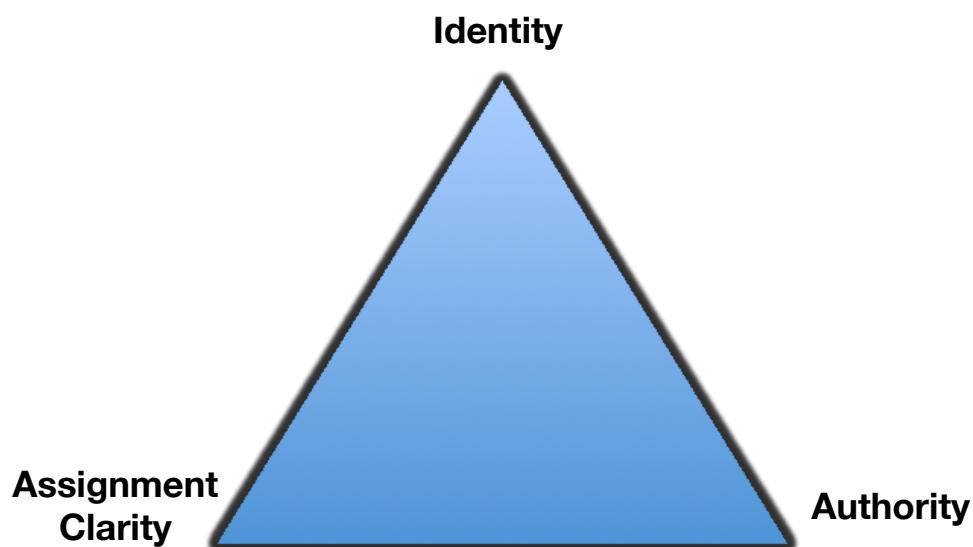


Knowing your Authority & Calling

Introduction - Freedom in Christ

The series does not start from the beginning! Instead it builds on the foundation laid out in the Freedom in Christ course. It assumes that each of us understand and are trying to live out the following basic truths:

- I am redeemed. I am in Christ. I am a saint, made holy in Jesus.
- I believe and live by what God says about me, not what the enemy says in my head.
- I make a daily choice to walk by the Spirit not to give in to the flesh.
- I submit to God and resist the devil.
- I have learnt to live out of the truth of who I am in Jesus and not live by my feelings.
- I exercise ongoing forgiveness towards others.
- I counter the enemy's lies with the power of God's truth, and continue to demolish strongholds in my life
- I live a life of service, not of self-satisfaction.

Pause and reflect

How many of these truths am I consistently living out?

How much have I allowed to drop?

What do I need to review & replace?

- Each of us has a calling to minister as Jesus did, as well as a unique personal God-given design. True freedom and blessing come as we choose to walk in that calling, and take hold of our true identity.
- The goal is for us to grow in intimacy with Jesus – greater awareness of his love, as well as greater willingness to obey - and therefore see restoration, victory and overcoming in our lives and the lives of others.

Session 1: Our Place, Authority & Completeness in Christ

This collection of statements, based on truths from the bible, remind us of our true identity as those who have chosen to follow Jesus. They are always a good place to start from when we need to remind ourselves just who God says we are. Simply read through them reflecting on each and allowing the truth to penetrate your spirit.

I am a child of God, born again, redeemed by the blood of the Lamb, filled with the Holy Spirit, and seek to live by every Word that comes out of the mouth of God.

Exercise:

In what area or situation in my life is God calling me to:-

Declare the truth about myself in Christ?

I will do this daily this week.

Exercise the authority that is mine in Christ?

I will do so this week.

Session 2: The Spiritual Battle & Our Place in it

Sometimes events that happen to us are 'just happening', but often they can be as a result of the ongoing Spiritual Battle. In order to discern whether this is the case, it can be helpful to reflect on these kind of questions:

- Is my bad mood "just happening?"
- Is my strained marriage "just happening?"
- Is the disintegrating relationship between parent and child "just happening?"
- Is the tension and division in a church "just happening?"
- Is oppressed corporate worship due merely to the weather and the seasons?
- Why does a selfish and stingy spirit or one of division, or rebellion, or..... (fill in the blank) persist in a church/family/community from generation to generation?
- Is a persistent lack of joy and zeal due merely to personality?
- Is the disintegration of a society "just happening?"
- Are communities in disrepair and oppressed by crime, drugs, murder, suicide, and hopelessness merely because of socio-economic issues?
- Are civil tensions, persecution of Christians and wars around the world "just happening?"
- Are bigotry, prejudice, and ethnic cleansings "just happening?"

As we spend time listening to God, if we sense that there could be a spiritual cause to some of these events, it may be helpful to pray some of the following prayers:-

Pray through the Armour of God:

Read Ephesians 6:10-17, metaphorically 'putting on' each piece of Armour as you read the truth.

Pray the Prayer of St Patrick:

As I arise today,
may the strength of God pilot me,
the power of God uphold me,

The American word 'skidoo' is similar to the English 'scarper' or 'skedaddle', meaning 'to leave somewhere quickly'. It can be used by anyone who senses spiritual oppression coming over them.

If you haven't already done so, talk about what you sense is coming against you and what the enemy is trying to steal from you. You may be able to do this on your own or you may need help from your spouse or a close friend whom you trust.

As the thoughts come that are not from God, we need to 'catch' them and not allow them to just go through our minds. We can take them captive using these four simple steps. (It's important to actually speak the words out loud):

1. I nail _____ to the cross.

The thoughts could come as a feeling (anger, depression, hopelessness, rejection, self-protection, etc.) They could also come as words or phrases you're hearing like, "He doesn't really care about me," or "She's never going to change." You can even say, "'She's never going to change,' I nail you to the cross" or... "Depression, I nail you to the cross!"

2. I break all agreements I've made with _____ known or unknown and I repent of joining with _____.

3. I send _____ away from me!

4. Finally ask the Holy Spirit to reveal.. "Holy Spirit, what do you replace this with?" and wait for an answer.

Mind management: Eph 2:10 'For we are God's handiwork'. *From UCB thought for the day 18.12.2014*

Your mind is the doorway to your heart, and when a questionable thought arises, you always have a choice. You can throw the door open and let it in, or do what the Bible says: 'Fight to capture every thought until it acknowledges the authority of Christ' (2 Corinthians 10:5 PHPS). In other words, capture the thought before it captures you. Let's say a thought regarding your self-worth arises and says, 'You've been a loser all your life. You've failed in relationships and jobs and ambitions. You might as well write "loser" on your CV, for that's what you are.' The average person would say to that thought, 'You're right; come on in.' But you're not the average person! You're a new creation in Christ, led by His Spirit. So rather than let the thought in, take it captive, present it to the Lord and say, 'Jesus, this thought says I'm a loser and I'll never amount to anything. What do You think?' See what you're doing? You're submitting that thought to the authority of Jesus. If He agrees with it, then let it in. If not, kick it to the kerb! How do you know if He agrees or disagrees? Open your Bible and find out what God says about you. 'We are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do'(Jeremiah 1:5). What about this one? 'Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus' (Romans 8:1 NIV). Any thought that doesn't line up with God's Word doesn't pass the test--and doesn't gain entrance. That's how you manage your mind!

Session 3: Understanding and Dealing with the Enemy's Schemes

Praying the 5 Rs

These are 5 simple biblical steps which enable us to bring areas of our lives which have been influenced by the enemy back under God's rule and blessing, and at the same time rid us of enemy activity.

Recognise and name the area of sin in your life where the enemy has a hold, & confess the ways it plays out day to day

Repent & turn back to God's truth and love. Receive God's complete and free forgiveness

Rebuke the spirits which have had access to you in this area, and break the enemy's power

Replace by declaring the truth over your life and a decision to walk in the opposite spirit

Receive the empowering/infilling work of God's Spirit

... now **Rejoice** that you are forgiven and free by the grace of God!

Exercise:

Ask God to show you an area in your life where the enemy has some ground (topos/foothold) e.g. Fear of rejection or anger. Pray simply through the 5 R's outlined above, in relation to the issue God has shown you, with a friend if you can. Stand in agreement with your partner as they pray, as they can for you in turn.

Session 4: The Nature & Causes of Strongholds

Declaring Truth Exercise:

One of our greatest weapons in the Spiritual Battle is the declaration of TRUTH in our lives.

Ask God to show / remind you of 2 key truths about your relationship with Him which he wants you take hold of more fully:

Now move to a different area of the room, stand and simply declare these truths over your life.

Dealing with Love Deprivation

Often we find ourselves in a cycle of Love Deprivation which can be really unhelpful and destructive:-

SIN → GUILT / DEFEAT → SHAME / SELF LOATHING → PAIN → NEED FOR COMFORT → SIN

The best way to break this cycle is to consistently press into God's love and truth by faith, instead of allowing living out of the feelings of emptiness and isolation. Every time we choose to stand in the place of pain – and choose obedience and intimacy with Jesus instead of sin comfort – the power of the addictive cycle is permanently broken at a new level. Freedom usually comes with a series of small choices to obey, rather than as the result of one incredible deliverance! Accountability and transparency with other Christians is invaluable in breaking the addictive self-comfort sin cycle.

Lie detector test

Ask the Lord:

“Lord, are there things **I believe**, even about myself, or **I think**, or **I do**, which are not true, or in line with, who I am in Jesus?”

When He shows you, then set about renewing your mind or your actions with the five Rs (session 3) in the power of the Spirit.

If you find yourself really stuck in one of these areas, do ask for help - from a trusted friend, your Life Group leader, through prayer ministry on a Sunday or through our Streams of Hope team.

Session 5. Living differently through Jesus

Asking God to Speak Specifically

It can sometimes be a challenge to genuinely find out what God's will is in any given situation, and yet God's plan is usually best established as a partnership between him & his people. He is often more interested in meaningful relationship with us rather than a specific course of action, so the more we spend time with him, the more we can ask for his specific revelation and direction.

As in any growing or developing relationship, the secret is to ask good (specific) questions, e.g.

- What do you want to accomplish, Lord?
- Do you want us to go away on that weekend?
- How much money should I give, Lord?
- Who should we invite to lunch, Lord?
- What would really bless _____?
- What is your strategy, Lord?
- What are you asking of me, Lord?
- What is the enemy's assignment against us, Lord?
- What sin is there in my heart?
- Why does the enemy have access/jurisdiction in this situation?
- Should I say anything, Lord? How do I say it?

Exercise:

Think of a situation in your life today. What are the strategic questions you need to ask God?

Ask Him. Decide to accept, and act on, what you believe to be the answer.

“Protecting the Time” prayer

It can be really helpful to pray this specific prayer before trying to spend time listening to God. It's a bit like deliberately turning off the radio or TV before an important conversation. If we take seriously the spiritual battle around us then we can use the authority which Jesus has given us (see Ephesians 6:12) to pray in this way:-

- a. Bind Satan & his evil spirits from distracting us
- b. Forbid our own human will from distracting us
- c. Invite the Holy Spirit to come and speak

Example prayer: “In Jesus’ Name, I bind & rebuke every demonic spirit that would oppose our time in any way. Spirits, I bind you and command you to the feet of Jesus. I forbid any interference from our flesh, all fleshly thinking, imagination and human wisdom. (I also put away my love and any previous knowledge of this situation/person.) I invite You, Holy Spirit, to come, and I thank You that you are going to speak clearly and specifically to me in Jesus’ Name. Amen.”

[Note. We command the enemy and his spirits ‘to the feet of Jesus’, the exalted Jesus; not ‘to the foot of the cross’ which is for our sin. Satan goes to the feet of the exalted and victorious Jesus where he will be dealt with].

Session 6. Taking & Exercising our Spiritual Authority

Exercise: Praying with God's Authority

Use the following guidelines as you begin to pray about a specific situation/concern:

1. Ask:

What is God's purpose? Listen for the answer...

Then use the authority God has given you to proclaim/declare it into being (as well as taking any action necessary).

2. Then ask:

What is opposing God's purpose? Listen for the answer...

Then use the authority God has given you to bind it and prevent it (as well as taking any action necessary).

For a person:

So... Instead of praying: 'Lord, bless my friend'...

Ask God: 'Lord what is Your purpose for my friend? What do You want for my friend?' then declare it in the heavenly realms.

Then ask God to show you 'What is coming against/preventing Your purposes for my friend?'

Then take authority over it, bind it and prevent it in the heavenly realms.

For a gathering/service:

Instead of praying: 'Lord, bless our time'...

Ask God: 'Lord, what are your purposes this morning/evening?' Listen. Declare and proclaim them.

Then 'Lord, what is getting in the way of Your purposes?' Listen. Rebuke, bind, and banish them.

"For the Son of man is as a man taking a far journey, who left his house, and gave authority to his servants, and to every man his work, and commanded the porter to watch." Mark 13:34,

'When Jesus had called the twelve together, He gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and He sent them out to preach the Kingdom of God and to heal the sick.' Luke 9:1-2

Session 7: Discovering Our Calling 1

How God 'SHAPE's us:

In discerning what God is calling us to for a particular season, it is important to take all of the following criteria into consideration. Use these questions as a starter to prompt prayer, ideas, discussion with friends & leaders.

Spiritual gifts

What spiritual gifts (prophecy, words of knowledge, miracles, healing) has God given for the benefit of others?
Having you asked him what they are?

Heart

What desires, hopes, interests, dreams, ambitions and affections do you have that you can do for God's glory?
What do you do for the sheer enjoyment of it?

Abilities

What are you naturally good at with little effort, no matter how small or insignificant it might feel?

Personality

Are you introverted or extroverted? Do you love routine or variety? Are you more "feet on the ground" or "head in the clouds"? Do you more "think things through" or a "feel things deeply"? How does this affect how and where you use your gifts and abilities?

Experience

What lessons did you learn growing up? What were your favourite school subjects, or favourite jobs? How have you served God in the past? What problems, hurts, thorns and trials have you learned from?

Session 8: Discovering Our Calling 2

Begin with the End in Mind

To begin with the end in mind means to start with a clear understanding of your destination. If beginning with the end in mind is a helpful planning technique, then visualising your own funeral might be the ultimate life planning tool. Write down your visualisation of what you want to be said about you at your funeral with regard to your accomplishments, good works and personality ... You may have work, my spouse, my children, church, my health, and leisure activities.

Time Line

It has been said that a picture is worth a thousand words. If so then capturing your life on paper with a timeline exercise may be worth millions. A timeline or lifeline exercise is a grid that allows you to have a bird's eye view of your life.

Putting your timeline on paper is an opportunity to record vital information about your life and past. There are several benefits to completing this exercise. It helps you:

- See the themes that connect and cut across seemingly different events.
- Recognise key achievements, growth opportunities, lessons, persons, new wisdom, and so on.
- Realise the value of negative shifts as opportunities toward positive shifts.
- Increase a sense of purpose by connecting life events in new ways.
- Find new meanings between your life at present in relation to your past and future.
- Understand how your experiences better prepared you to face future challenges.
- Note how your responses to events have shaped your life and character (and not events themselves).

Linked to the above exercise

- 1) Let go of disappointments, regrets ... where can you go from here?
- 2) What have you got now available now that you can use to begin to start outworking on your calling on your life?

Strengthsfinder

Each adult individual possesses a certain number of fixed universal personal-character attributes, 'talents' ; which, together, result in an individual's tendency to develop certain skills more easily and excel in certain fields in a sustainable way while failing or not being able to sustain success or high levels of effectiveness in other fields. Additional Suggestions/reflections on finding your calling

A. Things to know and think about

1. Know your Bible and saturate your mind with it.

God speaks. You get to know His heart, His desires, His intentions, and His principles.

As you read, He can speak.

2. Know your gifts and know yourself.

3. Ponder the needs of the world.

‘The need does not constitute the call’ but it may prompt it. Let God call you, not the need.

‘What is on your heart?’ What is your burden / passion?

4. Read autobiographies and biographies of Christians.

Widen your horizons. See what is possible through others. It could be through you!

Speak to Paul Phillips if you would like ideas of possible books to read

5. Know your circumstances.

...but don't be wrongly bound by them. Parents, health, houses, lands, children, age and so forth; all of them matter in our calling, but none of them is decisive. They can all be overridden.

B. Things to do

6. Pray for God to put you where you can be best used for his glory.

There are all sorts of places to serve in the world. The Lord knows the best fit for you.

7. Listen humbly to trusted & Godly people in your life.

Who knows you? Who do you know who has wisdom and perspective? What do they advise / recommend?

8. Cultivate absolute surrender of all you are and have to Christ.

It's normally a process, not a snap decision.

Any time we want to hear from God, the method is the same: praying, reading the Bible, meditating, talking with godly friends, and patient listening.

Generally we don't recognise our calling overnight; rather, God reveals it to us gradually over the years.
