Purpose:


- to introduce himself in preparation for his hoped for forthcoming visit to Rome
- to establish a support base for a 4th mission to Spain
- to resolve a pastoral tension rising from a theological disagreement between Jewish & Gentile believers

Paul's theological unpacking of the gospel in Romans is foundational for anyone who wants to follow Jesus Christ.

INTRODUCING THE GOSPEL - ROMANS 1:1-17

1:1 - About Paul

- Paul means diminutive/small - changed from Saul
- Servant of Christ Jesus - a bond slave born out of love & devotion not duty
- Called to be an apostle (sent one)



- Set apart for the gospel of God

1:2-6 - About the Gospel

- It is from God (v1)
- It is promised beforehand through his prophets & the Holy Scriptures (v2)
- It concerns his son - who was both human (v3) & divine (v4)
- It has implications for us (v5) - we have received grace & obedience.

1:7-15 - About the Roman church

- To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints (v7)
- Only letter by Paul to a church he didn't plant himself
- Addressing issues stemming from the different cultural backgrounds of the believers
- Paul expresses his great affection for them
 - Paul thanks God for them (v8)
 - He prays for them constantly (v9-10)
 - He longs to see them for mutual encouragement (v11-12) although he has been prevented / hindered by circumstances (v13)
- Paul is looking for a 'harvest' INSIDE & OUTSIDE the church (v13-15)

1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. **17** For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: “The righteous will live by faith.”

Explaining the Gospel v16-17

- The gospel is offensive (v16)
 - Salvation is free & undeserved
 - We are so evil only the death of God's son could save us
 - Jesus is the only way to God
 - The gospel is based on suffering and serving
- The gospel is the power of God (v16)
- The gospel is for everyone (v16)

- The gospel reveals God's righteousness (v17)
